THINK ON THESE THINGS - September

I often think about the people Jesus encountered and what happened to them later in life. Take for example, the woman caught in adultery and threatened with being stoned to death found in John 8.

² At dawn Jesus appeared again in the temple courts, where all the people gathered around him, and he sat down to teach them. ³ The teachers of the law and the Pharisees brought in a woman caught in adultery. They made her stand before the group ⁴ and said to Jesus, "Teacher, this woman was caught in the act of adultery. ⁵ In the Law Moses commanded us to stone such women. Now what do you say?" ⁶ They were using this question as a trap, in order to have a basis for accusing him.

But Jesus bent down and started to write on the ground with his finger. ⁷ When they kept on questioning him, he straightened up and said to them, "Let any one of you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." ⁸ Again he stooped down and wrote on the ground. ⁹ At this, those who heard began to go away one at a time, the older ones first, until only Jesus was left, with the woman still standing there. ¹⁰ Jesus straightened up and asked her, "Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?"

¹¹ "No one, sir," she said.


"Then neither do I condemn you," Jesus declared. "Go now and leave your life of sin."

No doubt it was a turning point in her life. Jesus defended her physically by not allowing the crowd to kill her. He also restored her spiritually and emotionally by not condemning her or her actions. Notice Jesus did not encourage her lifestyle. He did not affirm her choices. Yet, Jesus' words provided healing and compassion when others would have legally killed her. The Word of Life invited her to a transformed life.

When we forgive others or receive mercy from them, we are freed from the past. How often do we allow past sins, poor judgment, and hurtful events to continue to harm us? Words that were spoken long ago keep some of us paralyzed. This is not to say that what happen was right and costs shouldn't occur. Actions have consequences so we remember and learn from the past. But we can't live there. Only those with no future live in the past. Receiving forgiveness and mercy is the first step to moving toward a peaceful and content future. I hope the woman found gracious harmony in moving forward with her life. Maybe not all at once but eventually finding her way to be reconciled with the Lord. "Go now and leave your life of sin" sounds like an invitation for a hopeful future.

If you or someone you know needs to hear words of forgiveness, grace and mercy, I invite you to join us in September for worship services. Like the woman, we can move forward into the lives God desires for us. A life with a future, not stuck in the past! See you then! Pastor Dave



Ministry Training Opportunity



Have you ever wanted to gain more confidence about visiting someone who is sick or lives in a care facility? Are there times when you aren't sure of what to say to someone going through a crisis? Do you feel like God might be calling you to a more compassionate and caring lifestyle? If so, then check out this online class on Care Ministry. This six-week course is designed to

be done at home and online.

Participants are expected to have:

- An interest in providing meaningful visitation to those in hospitals and nursing homes.
- A wish to promote a calm atmosphere for the patient/resident so that they feel at ease
- A desire to feel more confident about entering a hospital and/or nursing home room, what to say and do, as well as how to react.

Desired outcomes

- Build confidence for those who regularly are called to visit hospitals and nursing homes so that the student can be reassuring and calming to the patient/resident.
- Learn how to react to various situations in hospitals and nursing homes to make the visit meaningful.
- Be able to use the tools needed to stay in touch with patient/resident and family.

Learning experiences

- Week 1: Introductions and Course Prep
- Week 2: Ground Rules to Pastoral Care
- Week 3: Personal Experiences with or in Pastoral Care
- Week 4: Spiritual Care and Hospital/Nursing Home Protocol
- Week 5: Emergent and Crisis Visitation
- Week 6: A Time for Role Playing and Self Reflection

The class is online and requires a computer with access to internet, including a webcam and microphone or headset. Participants must be able to participate in web conferencing and complete online assignments.

Online class meets Monday evenings from 5:00-7:00 p.m. CT on Sept. 14, Sept. 21, Sept. 28, Oct. 5, Oct. 12, and Oct. 19, 2020.

Book Study

As the protests have moved away from the forefront of our 24hour news cycle, it's important that we don't forget the need to keep fighting back the evil of racism in our society, our organizations, and our own hearts. Becoming anti-racist is a marathon, not a sprint, and it is the continued work that we do after racism is no longer the hot-button issue that allows us to affect change and make the world a more equitable place for everyone.

Doing the work of fighting racism has multiple avenues. It's absolutely important to go to marches and make our voices heard, but there's also a level of continued education that needs to be done to help us make changes on a personal level. That's why I'd like to offer a book study for young adults so that we can learn and encourage one another in our journey. We will be meeting the 2nd and 4th Mondays each month starting September 14 to read through the book *I'm Still Here: Black Dignity in a World Made for Whiteness* by Austin Channing Brown. The book is a really insightful look at what it means to be Black in America and an encouragement for non-Black folks to recognize racism and call it out, even in our churches.

I hope you'll consider joining me. It's a really good book (I've already read it!) and will provide some really insightful conversations. We will decide by group consensus whether we want to meet socially-distanced in-person or via Zoom.

From the Director of Operations

Wow! My first two months at the First United Methodist Church of Leavenworth has been filled with excitement and blessings.

It is sheer excitement to watch capital structure projects, which you all have invested in for years, come to fruition. The exterior stone repair is still on track to be complete by mid-September, we are just waiting on the stone replacement pieces to arrive from the stone-cutting suppliers. The Leavenworth City Commission approved the parking and sidewalk project, which has been on the books for the last two years. Construction began on Monday, August 17th, and should be completed by the end of the month. The project will include angled parking on Chestnut St. and the north alley (old Market Street) and a 6-foot-wide sidewalk all the way around the green space. We are truly blessed to be accomplishing this project in conjunction with our Christian brothers and sisters from the First Presbyterian Church. The funding for this project is being shared between the two churches and Geiger Ready-Mix, who is providing all the concrete and enhancements at no charge. To see the co-laboring fellowship with the construction crews and overseeing parishioners of each church has been both a blessing and inspirational. Photos of the progress are included in this newsletter.

These two major projects were the last funded capital improvements which include: stained glass window restoration/renovation, the kitchen remodeling, the sanctuary fans, the partial HVAC replacements, the exterior stone restoration/replacements, refurbishing the hand bells, the nursery fire exit, new Fellowship Hall lighting and the angled parking/sidewalks around the green space east of the main church building. Moving forward, we are waiting on a design and a bid for a new ADA approved ramp directly into the front doors. We will innovatively work together on raising funds to accomplish this project.

More exciting news is the United as One event we will be hosting September 17-19 on our newly renovated green space. Churches from around county will come together for Praise, Prayer and Worship nightly from 6:30-8:30pm. We will send out more detailed information on this event in the next few weeks. We will need volunteers to help as escorts to the restrooms, road guards across 5th Street for parking and more.

By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another. John 13:35

The blessings I have received have been in the friendships I have made with my brothers and sisters in Christ Jesus and with the mission partners I have meet in the community. The Lord has commanded us to use our time, treasure and talents to bring Kingdom to our homes, our church and our community. I ask that each of you pray on how you can bring Kingdom in your own way. We have many opportunities for serving on a weekly or monthly basis through the generosity and compassion of this church. Steven Shade and I stopped by the Leavenworth Mission last Tuesday, simply to interview our mission partners, and wound up loading shopping charts full of food to be distributed to those in need, for two hours.

The Daily Touch is a series of informative testimonial and praise videos focusing on how we are bringing the Kingdom of God to our families, church and local community, due to fully launch in September. The videos will be presented on our website. We are doing these videos, not for individual praise or personal recognition, but to glorify God.
