for some and exceeded them for others. Ministry during a pandemic is new to all of us. In all things, grace, mercy and faith! Thanks for letting me be your pastor.

Dave's End of Year Review for 2020

Personal – 2020 has been a good year considering all of the turmoil with COVID. I am POA for my Dad so those responsibilities have given me additional duties. His expenses are simple and he has money so that is good. Kind of like his business manager. We are fortunate he moved to Life Care Center before COVID hit. Dad has had several health issues in 2020 that required trips to hospital. One of my new "hobbies" has been liquidating the Seneca house. I've sold some stuff from my baseball collection and worked through forty years of accumulation while not messing too much with house. Ebay has become side hustle this summer.

Family - Rhonda and I celebrated 32 years of marriage in July. I have lost 20+ pounds from July to present. Feel good and clothing fits better. Blood pressure is back within acceptable standards. Rhonda and I spent time in Branson and Weston for little vacations. All three of us went on our first cruise to Yucatan Peninsula in January before COVID. Spent two days in New Orleans before the cruise. My spring training baseball trip with Taylor was a victim of COVID. The Yorks are planning to go to Memphis and Nashville in January 2021. Taylor had surgery in June to seal a leaking extra value in his heart. He has recovered fully and we have recovered financially, too.

Ministry - In 2020, I became an official member of the Great Plains Conference after transferring from Mountain Sky Conference. 2020 – 6 baptisms, one wedding, eight funerals in pastoral role. Confirmation class with Kristen Howell for two of our youth in the summer. I am still working as Leavenworth Network Leader for area UMCs. The four churches that serve in LV Network are Trinity UMC, S. Heights, Easton and Lansing Crossroads. We welcomed a new pastor, Changhyun Kim, into our Network in July. Jack Walker graciously toured Changhyun, his wife – Yeokyeong, and me on trip around Ft. Leavenworth and lunch at Lion's Club. Highlights included church wide study of *With Jesus in the Upper Room – Gospel of John* for Lent. The Journey's End, three session seminar on end of life considerations, (last one was cancelled) hosted by Bill Kidder and Nurture and Care ministry. Liz Brown, Mike Crow and Arlen Briggs spoke. Anticipate preaching 47 of 52 Sundays of 2020 (present for three when I did not preach). For 2020, continuity has been valuable.

Service - I serve as Transition in Ministry mentor to Rev. Matthew Wilke at Tonganoxie UMC. In September, I agreed to be a dissertation coach for DMIN student at Asbury Theological Seminary. This is new venture for me and will be enjoyable to renew old relationships with some ATS folks. I am a member of the Leavenworth Rotary Club. I was speaker of Lansing HS baccalaureate in May (video). One new area of service that I committed to is working at Leavenworth Mission. I load carts of groceries for food pantry on Tuesday. Along with working at Community of Hope on Thursday, this is my primary mission among the needy. We served as host church for United as One, our Leavenworth County worship event. I was part of planning team as well. The colleagues I met is best part. We'll plan to do more in the future. In 2020, I taught the Prayer Course, an eight-week class on prayer. I am in a small group on Tuesday and sing on Wednesday.

COVID - The adaptive leadership displayed due to COVID was and is a challenge. In some ways we thrived as a church due to our investment in technology and commitment to hire a virtual ministry coordinator. Our online services were improved through additional cameras. Zoom and 365 team/ staff meetings have become common. Reopening in June was done well and we are at four months with no COVID cases. PTL! Preaching to an empty sanctuary was an adjustment but we continued to offer our worship to the Lord through preaching, song, and prayers. We said goodbye to Wayne Parks and added Ed Garven as Director of Operations. We intentionally worked hard to connect with our community through shared partnership in Deeper Windows Association, Leavenworth Mission, Trinity House Food Pantry, and Community of Hope. We contributed \$2500 to Leavenworth and Lansing HS for COVID relief as part of community connection. Our goal is to grow beyond the walls of the church in bringing Kingdom to Leavenworth/Lansing! FUMCL has a new partnership with a home school group on Fridays.

Facility - In 2020, some long range plans were accomplished in our facility. Our sidewalk and parking project was done right on time to host the United as One event. We added nine new parking spaces and seventeen on alley side. The cooperation with FPC was significant and a witness to the city of Leavenworth. Our mortar and stone repairs are done so the building will stand another 100 years. We replaced three HVAC units and installed air circulation units in sanctuary. We redecorated and updated Wesley Hall. Books were moved to classrooms so more people could use them. The youth area in education building "The Underground" was repainted and new furniture purchased. In 2021, we hope to put in new ceiling tiles and flooring to make our facility first class. 2020 is the end our capital fund money so any long term construction will require a capital fund raiser with all of congregation participation.

What's Next - I am working on a team called the Equal Justice Initiative for 2021. Our purpose is to commemorate the lynching of Fred Alexander in Leavenworth with a historical marker and bring soil back from the spot so it can be consecrated. Cross racial reconciliation and teamwork is our goal. Edna Webster of Richard Allen Cultural Center is on board as is Marti Crow. I am hoping to add only few more folks for planning purposes including another at least one African American church. I am representing the Great Plains Conference in this area. In June, I participated in the Unity for Community march (first time ever doing something like that) – what a learning experience.

Overall – I am hopeful for FUMCL considering the fragile nature of our congregation. We are an aging congregation with few younger families and people ages 25-35. With the number of people who are getting comfortable online, we may be shifting away from focus on physical attendance. While we are holding up ok financially, we have had some folks move and pass away who contributed significantly to FUMCL. Distance can either make the heart grow fonder or people will fade away from their commitment to Christ and the Church. We'll see. I believe some of the adjustments we made in worship like more video testimonials, recording scripture and checking in process will be better. We'll save money on printing cost without hard bulletin. Significant decline in youth and children ministry due to COVID. Lack of CGSC families affected us, too. This effect should cause us to be more externally focused on kids in our schools, not the ones who show up here. AIR ministry is picking up again and could be a booming ministry. In church leadership, we are moving forward to stream line our leadership meetings and laity participation. The leadership will need to decide if we want to continue investing in our facility like an ADA ramp, remodel front of sanctuary, outdoor worship park and other potential upgrades. FUMCL is a generous and much more spiritually healthy church now than three years ago. We hope to do more church unified message/lessons with our children/youth/adults. Pastor Dave
