The psalmist wrote, "Look at how good and pleasing it is when families live together as one" (Psalm 133:1 CEV). This truth was seen when hundreds of people gathered for the United as One worship event. For three nights, worshipping together in the name of Jesus was the agenda for the Church! Through the planning, preparation and participation of over a dozen Leavenworth County churches, our community was unified in a common love for Jesus and Leavenworth.

I can't tell how proud and pleased I was for FUMCL to be the hosts of the event. One of the gifts we have been given is physical space. The asset of the green space and sidewalk/parking project was a blessing. To see the various people of Leavenworth come together as one in our backyard was a joy. I am grateful for the efforts of the staff and servants who work in providing hospitality and organization for the event. Goodness comes in many forms. One benefit was building relationships across racial, economic and denominational lines. Trust and respect were formed as we got to know one another better. We could see and hear the hearts of each other in our dreams for Leavenworth County. God's vision for a united yet diverse Church was embodied in this event. We worked together for common goals without competition for honor or seeking credit and praise. Teamwork was seen in its best sense.

I wonder sometimes why God allows so many different churches to exist when the desire of God's heart is unity (John 17). Perhaps it is because each of us has various strengths and gifts that God has given. No one has it all. Style and personality are part of who we are. Paul's analogy of the Church being like the physical body (1 Corinthians 12) is certainly appropriate. We need each other in order to be strong and healthy. Many church homes are available so all can find a place in God's Kingdom. While we are different, we strive for unity in living for Jesus Christ and declaring his name. This purpose should transcend all other characteristics of gender, race, ethnicity, age, economic status, or other ways we find to separate ourselves. We observed this truth in the United as One event- One Church, one hope, one baptism, one faith, one God and Father of us all (Ephesians 4). The Church hasn't always lived this way. We often are the source of much division and conflict. That is a sad but accurate statement. Now, we envision a movement of the Holy Spirit drawing people together. Hope for a better tomorrow comes from trusting in God through Christ!

The goodness of peace with each other is desperately needed during our uncertain and graceless age. Our love of God through Jesus Christ can be the catalyst for vital growth in Leavenworth. Efforts like the Unity March and United as One continue to connect us. Whether you are a church goer or not, make every effort to keep the bond of peace as seen in care and blessing. We witnessed joy of serving one another through acts of kindness and generosity. We saw talents and gifts being used to worship God. We experienced the blessing of living together as brothers and sisters in the family of God. How good and pleasing it is when families live together as! Pastor Dave



The last three months at First United Methodist Church of Leavenworth have been extremely productive. The exterior stone repair was completed. The sidewalk and angled parking project, around the green space, was completed and is in full use throughout the week. These two major projects were the last funded capital improvements which include: stained glass window restoration/renovation, the kitchen remodeling, the sanctuary fans, the partial HVAC replacements, the exterior stone restoration/ replacements, refurbishing the hand bells, the nursery fire exit, new Fellowship Hall lighting and the angled parking/sidewalks around the green space east of the main church building. Moving forward, we are waiting on a design and a bid for a new ADA approved ramp directly into the front doors. We will innovatively work together on raising funds to accomplish this project.

The United as One event, which we hosted September 17<sup>th</sup>-19<sup>th</sup>, on our newly renovated green space, was a tremendous success. Churches from around county came together for Praise, Prayer and Worship over three consecutive nights. We had approximately 300 people in attendance per night and raised over \$5000 for local charities. The offering and excess budget funds were equally distributed between the Leavenworth Community of Hope, the Alliance Against Domestic Violence and the Leavenworth Mission. I want to thank all of you for your prayers, encouragement and attendance (both in person and online). We brought Light into the Darkness. 






# Youth Ministries in the Midst of a Pandemic

Hello all! I just wanted to give you a quick update on how youth group is going in spite of the pandemic. First of all, I am SO EXCITED(!!!) to see the youth who have come back to youth group this year. Between maternity leave and the lockdown, it has been so long since I've seen everyone and I'm glad to be able to reconnect. If your youth hasn't come back to youth group (for any myriad of reasons), please know that they are so missed. I think about and pray for each of my kids regularly. It's such a joy to be able to share a portion of their week with them.



Ministry in the middle of a pandemic has been admittedly odd. We meet outside as often as possible and when inside, maintain 6 feet of distance and wear masks. Games are limited to that which require no contact or running around. This is not my preferred way of doing things, but it appears this is the new normal for a while. Despite all of this, we've had some great discussions and

some laughs. We just finished our opening series based off of the book, *Where is God When it Hurts?* by Phillip Yancey. We thought it incredibly timely considering how much suffering is in our world this year. This past weekend, we started a four-week series on how to be an anti-racist. I've loved our discussion already and can't wait to delve deeper with them into how our faith informs the way we can be change agents in our world.

As for going forward, we will play a lot by ear. We're quickly approaching when we will need to be indoors every week for youth group due to the cooler weather. For the time being, we will meet in the main church building when we are indoors; the Fellowship Hall provides ample space and we can hang out in Wesley Hall on weeks that we have a smaller group of students. Until we go back to "normal," I'll keep looking forward to taking trips and lock-ins and sharing meals, and I'll keep praying for your kiddos and your families. Please let me know if there's anything I can do to be help or support for your families during this strange time.

Youth group will be from 6:30-7:45 to start, and as the sun goes down earlier, we will adjust to a start time of 5-6:15 until the weather gets too cold and we will be inside. In the case of another shutdown, we will move entirely online for meetings.

#### What is the Purpose of Young Adult Ministry?

What a strange time in the life of the church, amiright? Just like I mentioned in my article about youth ministries, young adults' ministry looks a bit different in light of the pandemic, as well. First of all, right now we have started a study on  $2^{nd}$  and  $4^{th}$  Monday nights from 6:30-8pm on *I'm Still Here: Black Dignity in A World Made for Whiteness* by Austin Channing Brown. We meet in Wesley Hall with full masks and distancing – the whole works.

Despite the strange setup, I'm so excited about this book! I've read it twice already (this'll be my third time) and it has so much to say, not only to an audience grappling with where we are in what was "supposed to" be a post-racial world but which is actually crawling with injustices, but also what it means to be the Church at a time like this. I'm hopeful that we will have many deep and fruitful conversations around the book that help us figure out what God is calling each and every one of us to do to combat racism in our lives, church and society. If you're still interested in joining this group, it's not too late! For probably one more week, I could get you all caught up with the rest of our group. The more the merrier! Additionally, we will be rescheduling or D&D social night for some time in October so if you weren't originally planning to join but you'd like to now, please let me know. I'll have details on the exact date soon.



In the coming months, I have high hopes for activities to meet the needs of our young adults from social events, more book studies, parenting speakers, outings, and a Fresh Expressions group. Some of these things will have to wait (like the Fresh Expressions and certain outings) and some things will just look really different than they might have otherwise. No matter it's form, I'm praying that God will show up as we wait out this pandemic and imagine what ministry may look like in the future when all of this is over.



The goal of our children's ministry is for every child 4 to 12 years old to know that Jesus loves them and so do we.

We will continue doing our virtual Children's ministry for families that choose to worship at home, but starting October 11, we will also have in person Kid's First Worship during the 10 am service. We will be following the same virtual lesson. Children from 4 to 12 years old should start the service with their parents and they will be dismissed after the Children's Moment.


